| Does the CoC funding include programs for domestic violence shelters with rehabilitation programs included and homeless rehabilitation and reintegration day programs? | Funding Domestic Violence shelters or rehabilitation/reintegration day programs are not eligible activities under HUD Continuum of Care funding. |
| Do applications need to meet a minimum budget amount to be competitive? | All projects must have a minimum request amount of \$50,000 each. |
| What is the longest term of Rapid Rehousing? 12 months, or can it be longer even though the grant period is only 1 year? | Rapid Rehousing may provide supportive services for short-term (up to 3 months) and/or medium term (for 3 to 24 months) tenant-based rental assistance. For details, please consult 24 CFR § 578.51 and § 578.53. |
| Will the CoC put forth more than 1 bonus project for submission to HUD or just one project? | The CoC will include all new projects that pass threshold review, evaluation, ranking and Riverside County CoC Board of Governance approval in its application to HUD except that HUD limits to one Supportive Services Only – Coordinated Entry (SSO-CE) project application per CoC. CES lead agency is the only entity that can apply for SSO-CE project application. |
| What is the term of new project grants? | Proposals selected and approved by Riverside County CoC Board of Governance will be submitted to HUD as part of the Riverside County CoC application for the FY2022 Program Competition. Once awarded by HUD, the new projects will be funded for 12-month operation with start dates in 2023. HUD understands that new projects may need additional time for new project preparation and ramp up and would allow the new projects to have up to a grant term of 18 months to spend the 12-month funding. All projects awarded through the FY2022 HUD CoC Program Competition must end by 12/31/2024. |
| My agency is a sole proprietor, are we qualified to apply for funding? | Only organizations recognized as 501 (c)(3) nonprofit organizations or government entities may receive HUD CoC Program funding. |
